

2017 Outstanding Junior Faculty Peer Reviewer Award

Diseases of the Esophagus will be giving an award to the top junior faculty Peer Reviewer of 2017 for the journal.

Award

- The winner of the award will receive a travel grant of \$2000 USD to attend the 2018 ISDE world congress in Vienna, Austria. The grant will cover registration and travel expenses for the award winner.
- The winner of the award will be recognized in the September 2018 issue of *Diseases of the Esophagus* and will be recognized in person at the 2018 ISDE world congress in Vienna, Austria.

Judging Criteria

The winner of the award will be determined by the co-Editors in Chief of *Diseases of the Esophagus*. Criteria that will be considered will include

- Number of peer reviews that the individual completed
- Timeliness of peer review completion
- Quality of peer reviews

Qualifications

- The peer reviewer must be an advanced trainee physician or a junior faculty physician with less than 8 years from completion of training from January 1, 2017
- Only peer reviews completed between January 1, 2017 and December 31, 2017 will be considered for the award.
